Human Rights and Public Administration

The Human Rights Act 1998 was intended to make the exercise of public power more fully accountable against standards of fundamental human rights and to provide effective remedies in UK courts for breaches of human rights. The UK Government had long had obligations to comply with the European Convention on Human Rights and with the judgments of the European Court of Human Rights but where previously a person's human rights could be vindicated only by a relatively inaccessible international court, the Human Rights Act set out to "bring rights home" and to make the rights imported from the Convention an intrinsic part of national law. Public administration reform in contemporary conditions especially is important to focus on public services users and in general on the process of modernization and improvement of services that are complemented by human rights values. That are those aspects of the reform that deal with the way public services are designed and delivered, such as the emphasis on service users and improvement of public service delivery standards, that are relevant to human rights.
