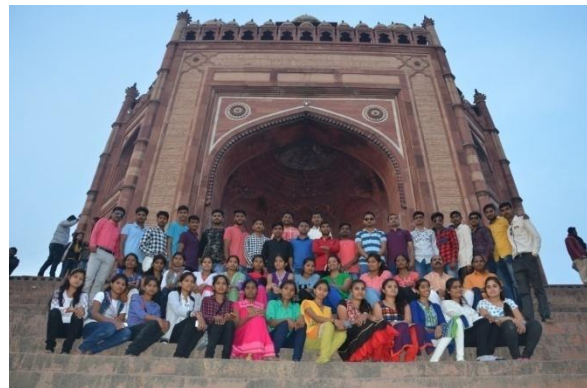


- **Poster Exhibitions:-**
